



NAATI TRANSLATOR STAMPS AND EXPIRY DATES

A NAATI translator stamp is used by translators to certify their translations. These stamps can be purchased by any credentialed, accredited or recognised, translator. An 'Expires' date is included on all NAATI translator stamps issued to credentialed translators who are required to revalidate – primarily translators with credentials issued after 1 January 2007 (see below for examples of stamp formats).

The 'Expires' date refers to the potential expiry date for the credential (at the time the stamp was issued). It does not reflect a date after which a translation is invalid or unacceptable. A translation from a NAATI credentialed translator should include the date at which the translation was completed.

If this completed translation date is within the period of validity for the credential, NAATI's opinion is that the translation should be accepted where it has been presented.
